Dear Parents,

We had a successful day of dental screening on Wednesday. All students from PS3 through 8th grade had their teeth checked by dentist, Dr. Bruce Walker. Dr. Walker encouraged the students to brush twice a day and floss daily as well. One new piece of information Dr. Walker shared is that after brushing teeth with a fluoride toothpaste, dentists are encouraging people not to rinse with water, but just spit out the excess toothpaste. This allows the fluoride to stay longer on the teeth for strengthening. The students had books read to them about oral hygiene and did fun activities while waiting their turn to be checked.

Each student was given a new toothbrush. Ask your child what they learned and encourage them to continue the practices they were taught. This was just a check-up screening, not a cleaning. Children and adults are both encouraged to get a check-up and cleaning once a year. Read the dental note in the Thursday folder, which was given to each child screened, to see Dr. Walker's recommendations. If he recommended that your child be seen by a dentist or orthodontist and you don't know of any in the area, please let me know and I can give you some names that others are using. We are so grateful for Dr. Walker's time and skill he was willing to share with the students.

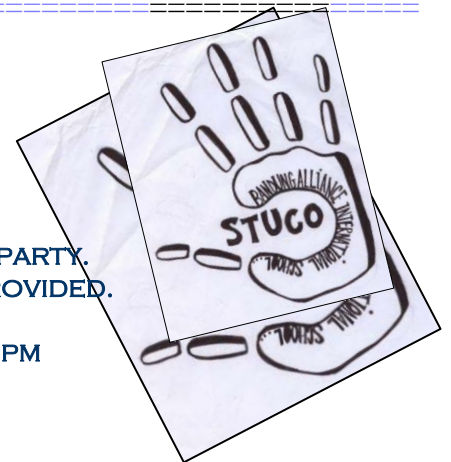

The Lady Eagles played a close game against the club team Suryakencana last Friday (Feb. 12). We lost, 25-20, but our girls played hard and with great determination, never giving up. We were especially proud of the girls coming off the bench for their support, intensity, and focus. They kept the game going and intense so that our starters could take breaks throughout the game.

Sarah Neveux was high scorer with 11 points; Melody Williams, 4; Joy Park, 2; Eun Young Park, 2; Cacie Neveux, 1. Fifi Then was chosen "Player of the Game" for her incredible defensive play.

She had several steals and rebounds throughout the game, plus she kept the other team from several fast break attempts.

On Tuesday, the Lady Eagles celebrated another victory, this time against Yahya. The final score was 42-24. Once again, Sarah Neveux was the leading scorer, making 25 points; Joy Park followed with 12; Eun Young, 2; Nancy Kim, 2; Melody Williams, 1. A technical foul was called on the other team during the second half. The referee told the Eagles coaches to pick someone to shoot the 2 technical free throws. Coach Matt chose Nancy, who was quite

surprised. Yet under intense pressure, Nancy sank both her free throws. The Lady Eagles went wild with excitement! Sarah was chosen "Player of the Game" for her leadership, intensity, numerous rebounds leading to baskets, offensive and defensive play. We would also like to recognize Joy Park's contribution to the win, especially for her great defensive man-to-man efforts throughout the game which resulted in several steals and turnovers.

The BAIS boys varsity team has had two very different opponents between Friday and yesterday. The Eagles played ITHB university, the college champions of West Java. Matt Marshall came off an ankle sprain to lead the Eagles with 13 points, 9 rebounds, 5 assists and 5 blocks. Terry also had a solid game with 8 points, 8 rebounds and 4 steals. All of the BAIS boys played hard to the end, never giving up. They played against bigger, older (18-21 years old) players, but never backed down. We all appreciate the good turn out to see the game on Friday.

Yesterday, the Eagles played BPI high school. Our opponents played a hard, physical game, but were no match for our pressing defense and inside game. The final score of 46-16 indicated the level of defensive pressure the Eagles put on BPI. Terry had five steals, Min Young had 4, and several others had steals, and good a rebounding game. Keun had his best game so far, with 8 points and 5 rebounds. Won Jin was his usual hyper self, harassing everyone wearing a BPI uniform, also getting 8 rebounds. Swimming News

Pre-season swimming continues on Tuesday and Thursday at Baros Military pool (the large military sport complex you can see from the toll road) starting after school until 5p.m. We hope to add two additional practices on Wednesday, 24th of February and March 3rd at Mason Pine. The cost to enter Mason Pines will be Rp. 10,000/entry. This price is for swim team members ONLY. The official swim season will then start Monday, March 8th. The preseason sessions are optional for swimmers and are only meant for those who can swim a minimum of 100 meters without stopping. Additionally, swimmers must pay the entry fee at time of the practice. Swimmers that make the team on March 12th will be charged 1 juta for the season including IISSAC tournament expenses and will be reimbursed for pre-season practices that they attended. Permission slips, available from Ibu Retno, need to be filled out and returned to Mr. Phillips before attending. More details will come next week.
