Dear students, staff and families,

We had members of DAC, administration and the teaching staff in the interviews and the students demonstrated well their specials' integration application as well as giving us feedback on their education here at BAIS. ## CLINIC NEWS



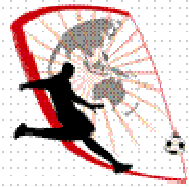
Many students and teachers have been struggling with a viral upper respiratory illness this week and last week. Please continue to encourage your students to wash their hands frequently, cough into their sleeve or shirt, get good rest (8 hours a night), increase fluid intake, and use decongestants and cough medicines as needed for symptom control.

There has been a recall on McNeil pharmaceuticals that all should be aware of especially while some may be taking medicines for this viral illness. Below is from the CNN web site forwarded to me by a concerned parent. If you have any medication that is listed by this company manufactured during the dates listed, please throw it out for your families' safety.

NEW YORK (CNNMoney.com) -- The Food and Drug Administration is looking into reports of at least 775 serious side effects from drugs recalled by McNeil, a division of Johnson & Johnson, according to a source close to a Congressional

investigation.

Included in the reports were 30 deaths, nearly all of which were found to not be tied to McNeil's recall of Tylenol, Motrin and Benadryl drugs from Jan. 1, 2008 through April 30, 2010, according to another source close to the investigation.
