Dear Parents,

We have had one child in 5rd grade and one in 7th grade come down with Chicken pox today and this past week. Please check your child daily for low grade fever, headache, stomach ache and /or red small bumps each morning before sending them to school. If your child has had the vaccine they may still be at risk for a mild form of the disease. If your child does get chicken pox, please let me know as soon as possible. They need to wait 5 days after the pox start before returning to school. They will need clearance from me to return to their classrooms. Please feel free to call me if you have any questions.

We are also starting our safety unit this week for elementary age children. They are learning about fire and bike safety, how to “always ask first” before going anywhere with someone, safe and unsafe touching and how to respond to this. Mrs. Newell and I are enjoying spending this time teaching your children how to stay safe. You will be informed the week before your child’s class studies this material. Please ask your children what they have been learning. This will help them to share the information and reinforce the learning.
