

Notes from Elementary Principal

Dear BAIS Parents and students,
Greetings from the desk of the elementary principal. I hope you all are doing well. Things are going great in the elementary. Just yesterday we received a major shipment of books that have been stuck in Jakarta since July! Next week many classes will be able to send home new math books and new writing books. Praise the Lord for this! Last year it took until March to get our books out of customs.

This month is also safety month at BAIS. For the last two weeks we have talked about and practiced Earthquake Drills at the school. This week and next week we are focusing on Fire Drills. During principal time the students and I talked about Fire Safety. Here are the top 10 Safety tips for kids.

1. If your clothes catch on fire **-stop, drop, and roll.**
2. Never play with matches, lighters, and cigarettes. One match can burn down your house.
3. **Crawl** low in smoke. Remember! Heat goes up, we go down.
4. If a fire happens, **get out** and stay out.
5. Memorize your address and the emergency phone number of your fire department. **(The Kota Baru fire department number is 7691-3113)**
6. **Smoke alarms** save lives. Check your smoke alarms once a month. Change batteries every year.
7. **Have fire drills** in your home at least twice a year.
8. **Know two ways** to get out of your house in case of a fire.
9. Have a **designated place** to meet outside the house in case of a fire.
10. Kids should cook or use microwave ovens only with adult supervision.

Please take time this week to talk about fire safety with your students whether they are elementary or secondary.

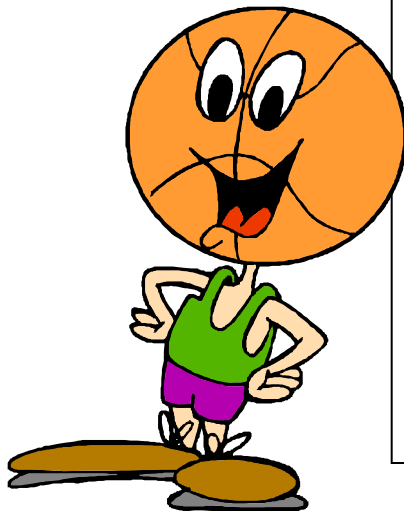
