1. Based on several conversations with current BAIS parents who have spoken with their peers or colleagues, it seems that a large percentage of families who are in the demographic we seek are unaware of BAIS located in Kota Baru. It seems that after 11 years of moving from Ciumbuleuit the general awareness of the existence of BAIS has decreased significantly.
2. As mentioned in earlier Dialogue with the Director meetings, BAIS has lowered the price point for tuition and introduced many discounts. This is making BAIS an option for a greater number of people. Our marketing efforts are looking to make this information known to a broader audience.
