

Updates from the Director

Happy New Year and welcome to the second semester! As we finish this week of online learning, I am excited to see our incredible students on campus once again this coming Monday, Jan. 17th. As you've seen, our theme this school year is simply, "together." We believe that together, with God, we can and will achieve great things and be an encouragement to one another. This semester, we look to build upon this togetherness and enjoy face-to-face learning in an even deeper way. Here are a few important updates related to our new semester on campus.

Online learning:

Per my recent email, beginning this semester, BAIS will no longer offer online learning in the way we have in the past. The department of education has required all schools to meet in person and stated that students/parents no longer have the option of choosing online learning. Here again is the wording from my previous email communication:

The government has now required that all schools meet in a full, face-to-face format. The government has also stated that, starting this semester, the requirement for schools to offer hybrid and online learning is no longer in effect. With those regulations in place, the expectation moving forward is that all students join classes on campus where teaching and learning is best carried out. We believe we are in a safe environment where successful on-campus learning can take place. This means that families may no longer "choose" online learning as an option. However, online learning options will remain available for students who must be absent due to the circumstances below:

- If a family is out of the country due to visa and/or other restrictions or due to quarantine requirements -
 - Students may join in a live audio and partial video of lessons and follow with their classes.
- If a child is showing symptoms of Covid-19, and who "pre-pandemic" would have just come to school, they may learn at home while they monitor those symptoms out of precaution.
 - Note: If the student is ill, we ask them not to attempt to join any live audio or video of class. They will receive assignments and make-up work via Schoology. RT-Antigen negative results may be needed before returning to school. Please consult our school doctor for guidance.
- If a student must abide by government mandated regulations given to schools due to the pandemic situation -
 - If BAIS is forced to temporarily close for any amount of time due to a covid-19 infection or suspect cases, teachers will utilize the online teaching/learning platforms and schedules only during this period.
- If a child (or family member in the home) is isolating due to a positive test result -
 - Audio and video learning options will be available for students who are feeling well, but must remain home due to isolation requirements.

For this semester and beyond, student absences due to non-essential circumstances will be considered unexcused. Excused absences will be given to students who fall into the above categories, and per what is stated in the BAIS Parent Student Handbook.





INFO FROM BAIS CLINIC

Dear Parents,

The Weekly Iron Folic Acid (WIFA) supplementation program for school-going adolescent girls (age 12-18 years) was implemented by the Indonesian Government in 2016. This program was implemented as a strategy to help tackle anemia. This program provides iron tablets in the form of 200 mg ferrous sulfate (FeSO₄) (equivalent to 60 mg of elemental iron) and 400 mcg folic acid, in accordance with WHO recommendation, to prevent adolescent girls from having iron deficiency anemia.

The iron-folic acid (IFA) tablets are provided free of charge utilizing school institutions as distribution channels. This government program is recommended to all girls aged 12-18 years. Next week, the school doctor will distribute it to all secondary girls. Each of these girls will be given 10 tablets to take home and should take it once a week during quarter 3.
