COVID Protocol for the event:

1. Each student will have their own supplies, and they will each be at individual desk.
2. Masks are required.
3. They will have to use hand sanitizer before entering the room, and touching each other isn't allowed.
4. No eating allowed.
5. Student mentors will occasionally come within a meter's distance of the students in order to provide instructions or clarify procedures.
6. This event is open only to students attending BAIS.
7. All the desks are sanitized prior to students entering.

Mentors will be wearing lanyards to allow students to differentiate between Made to Change mentors and other students. *(To prevent other secondary students from coming in contact with the children.)*

Handbook Spotlight

BAIS Community,

I love hearing the sounds of our children playing outside afterschool! For almost two years, their joyful cries and excitement were missing. As we continue to work together to provide a safe environment for our children to play and interact, I wanted to remind us of a few things.

Campus Hours:

- Monday - Friday, 7:30am - 6:00pm
- Saturday - Sunday, 8:00am - 6:00pm

Elementary students must be accompanied by an adult who is actively watching him/her after school (3:00pm) or on the weekend. The adult does not have to be a parent, but the office must be notified ahead of time if someone other than the child's parents (or approved guardians) will be picking them up. When the supervising adult leaves, so must the children under their supervision.

Secondary students may be on campus after school until 6:00pm but must leave the building by 4:00pm. On the weekend, *secondary students* may be on campus, at their parents' discretion, but are not permitted in the buildings. Students will be required to leave at 6:00 pm by the SATPAMS.

The only exception to the above is if students are participating in an activity being supervised by a staff member.

Thank you for your continued support and cooperation as we work together to cultivate a safe and caring community for our children to grow up in.
